## **Connecticut Unions Have No Record of McCormick Supporting Working People in His Home State**

*Union officials confirm what Pennsylvania's working people found out: Dave McCormick does not stand with working people.*

**Harrisburg, PA** – A top Connecticut labor official is weighing in on the US Senate race in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Connecticut AFL-CIO President Ed Hawthorne revealed that even the unions in Dave McCormick's home state don't know him and have never seen him supporting working people in the Nutmeg State.

"We are aware that Dave McCormick lives in a \$16 million Connecticut home, but we don't know him, and we have no record of him standing with working people here in any way, shape or form. It is puzzling to us that someone would attempt to cross state lines, pretend to represent working people and try to shamelessly recreate themselves in such a deceptive way," said Connecticut AFL-CIO President Ed Hawthorne. "This all seems pretty shady, even for a former hedge fund manager," Hawthorne concluded.

"Here in Pennsylvania, we have a word for someone who crosses our picket lines and sells out union members: a 'scab.' So when someone decides to carpetbag and run for a Senate seat somewhere they don't live while profiting off of mismanaging our pensions, we call them the same thing. Dave McCormick is a scab," said Angela Ferritto, president of the Pennsylvania AFL-CIO, which represents over 700,000 working Pennsylvanians.
