Something needs to change. By and large, the public supports investments in clean energy reforms. Twothirds of Pennsylvania residents support building a clean energy economy, according to a poll conducted


by The Nature Conversancy-PA. Union households support reforms in even greater numbers; 78% of union households believe clean energy is a worthwhile investment.




THE INFLATION REDUCTION ACT

On August 16, 2022 the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) was signed into law. The Inflation Reduction Act makes the largest-ever climate investment in world history, touching every economic sector that produces carbon pollution - power, transportation, buildings, industry, agriculture, and forestry.

The IRA has sparked a historic clean energy boom across America, creating hundreds of thousands of good-paying jobs – those should be union jobs. In addition, the IRA provides bonus credits for energy investments in low-income communities that pay workers prevailing wages, use registered apprenticeships, and build clean energy with domestic content - these communities deserve to thrive once again.

We created Union Energy to leverage the opportunities presented by the Inflation Reduction Act. The legislation will enable our nation to create a sustainable energy economy that provides opportunities for high-paying union jobs with benefits.













ENERGY ROUNDTABLE

In April 2024, the PA AFL-CIO and PA Building and Construction Trades Council hosted a meeting of union leaders from across the Commonwealth. More than 30 unions from multiple sectors were represented.

During a brainstorming session, leaders discussed how unions have lost jobs in the fossil fuel industry and want to be at the forefront of the transition to a sustainable energy economy. Emerging industries, which are part of this just transition, must embrace organized labor. Leaders stressed the importance of unions presenting a unified front in this coalition and representing the voice of reason that will help Pennsylvania meet its 2050 climate goals. Together, the unions developed the coalition's name: Union Energy, and its promise: Union Energy will create a sustainable and innovative energy economy today that allows all Pennsylvania families to have an opportunity to work in union jobs with union benefits. We will advance nonpartisan policies that create increased union opportunities by anticipating the challenges of tomorrow and working together to advance an innovative, sustainable energy economy.

Goals of the coalition were also outlined. Shared goals include advancing the legislative agenda in Pennsylvania and taking a proactive approach to guiding the transition to sustainable energy solutions. Union Energy will engage union members and community allies to work at the forefront of issues that matter to workers and our communities.

Union leaders also discussed the campaign's key legislative initiatives: capping orphan wells, public sector OSHA, and solar for schools.

UNION ENERGY MEETS WITH LABOR LEADERS

Prior to the 46th Constitutional Convention of the PA AFL-CIO in May, Union Energy Executive Director Ramon Becerra and Policy Director Paul Lemmon held a meeting with labor leaders. During the meeting, Union Energy shared its mission and goals as well as key legislative initiatives.

During the 46th Constitutional Convention, PA AFL-CIO members approved a resolution in support of Union Energy. The resolution outlines the need for a coalition to guide the just transition to a sustainable energy economy as well as the opportunity to create good-paying union jobs.

SUPPORT FOR UNION ENERGY

WHEREAS, access to adequate and affordable energy and energy sources are essential to protecting, maintaining, updating and expanding our infrastructure, securing essential water, transportation and community foundational systems, the rebuilding of a manufacturing economy, family sustaining jobs with family sustaining benefits, energy independence, outstanding public schools, access to medical care, sustainable food sources, adequate and affordable housing and sustaining our communities; and

WHEREAS, the effects of climate change in Pennsylvania, across the United States, and around the world are notably serious and growing, and severe weather, including floods, droughts, wildfires, extreme heat and sea-level rise have a disproportionate impact on working families and our communities in ways that call for focus and an effective and












CLIMATE JOBS PLAN

Envisioned by the Pennsylvania labor movement and authored by the ILR Climate Jobs Institute, Pennsylvania Climate Jobs Plan: A Worker-Centered Approach to an Equitable Clean Energy Future, provides concrete recommendations for ways Pennsylvania can create union jobs in an innovative energy economy. The report includes 28 key recommendations in the following areas: energy, industry, buildings, transportation, agriculture, infrastructure, and just transition.













EIGHT DAYS OF ACTION - CAMPAIGN KICKOFF

Cleveland-Cliffs Steelton, the nation's oldest operating steel mill, was the site of Union Energy's official kickoff. Labor leaders, union members, community representatives, company delegates, and climate researchers spoke about the importance of creating union jobs and released The Pennsylvania Climate Jobs Plan, a report authored by the IRL Climate Jobs Institute at Cornell University about an equitable clean energy future for Pennsylvania.
























UNION APPRENTICESHIP FACILITY TOUR














SOLAR FOR SCHOOLS

On July 11, 2024, the Pennsylvania legislature passed HB 1032, Solar for Schools. Championed by the Pennsylvania labor movement and introduced by Rep. Elizabeth Fiedler, the bill will create a grant program to fund solar arrays at schools across Pennsylvania by covering equipment and installation costs. This will, in turn, accelerate the construction of solar projects, create goodpaying union jobs with family-sustaining benefits, and revitalize our communities.

The Solar for Schools grant program is a critical piece of legislation that allows the Commonwealth to invest in our aging school buildings, which will positively impact all Pennsylvanians while allowing our Commonwealth to reap the environmental and economic benefits. By investing in and lifting up the building trades as a whole, Solar for Schools will support and sustain good paying, clean energy union jobs in the solar industry.








LABOR IN THE PULPITS



Members of Union Energy participated in Labor Day parades and events throughout the Commonwealth.
















WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA LAUNCH



THREE MILE ISLAND

In response to the announced reopening of Three Mile Island, made on September 20, 2024, Union Energy released a newsletter to its subscribers about the positive impact of the facility. The 20-year purchase agreement, signed by Constellation Energy and Microsoft, will launch the Crane Clean Energy Center, which will add more than 800 megawatts of carbon-free energy to the grid and create 3,400 direct and indirect jobs.










REGIONAL MAP

FOUNDING BOARD MEETING

Union Energy held its founding board meeting on December 4, 2024, in Harrisburg. Board members from a dozen unions joined the PA AFL-CIO and the PA Building and Construction Trades Council to discuss the coalition's goals and set priorities for 2025.

Board members discussed how the coalition can focus on both advancing its objectives and on growing union membership in the Commonwealth. They also discussed the industries that can become involved in renewable energy solutions and how the products can get to the market. Members talked about the importance of embracing this movement, as other states are moving forward with sustainable energy projects. Areas of Pennsylvania are well suited for creating and hosting data centers, which can bring jobs for union members. By collaborating with community partners, Union Energy can help frame public perception about data centers and innovative technologies.












